Title: Integrating Safe Patient Handling and Mechanical Lifts into Therapeutic Treatments

Course Description: Physical and Occupational Therapists perform patient handling, transfers and gait training for therapeutic intervention which places them at high risk for musculoskeletal injuries. Many therapists decline the use of lifting equipment due to their belief that the lifts reduce the effectiveness of their treatment sessions and delay the functional independence of the patient. This presentation will educate therapists to the benefit of incorporating lifting technologies into therapeutic interventions as well as introducing techniques to initiate challenging training more acutely and progress the patient safely. PowerPoint slides, videos and hands-on demos as well as case studies will be utilized

- Articulate the rational for the use of lifts in therapeutic treatments.
- Describe the current uses of Safe Patient Handling equipment in therapeutic treatments.
- Describe the perceived barriers and benefits to using safe patient handling equipment.
